

News in brief

Tenterden has remained in the top ten (out of a thousand) retail centres in the UK claiming sixth place – the highest in Kent – in this year's Harper Dennis Hobbs' Vitality Ranking. The analysis determines the health of high streets and shopping centres nationwide taking in factors such as vacancy rates and suitability to local consumer demands.



Financial support from the council has led to a 12 month reprieve for the G Service bus route, which links two sides of Ashford – Godinton Park and Repton Park with the Orbital Park via Bank Street in the town centre, the railway station, Newtown and South Willesborough. Stagecoach had planned to close the loss-making route. Frequency is one bus an hour, compared to the previous 30 minutes.

Following the refurbishment of the gym and exercise studio last year, Julie Rose Stadium is getting a brand new athletics track after the council invested £300,000 on a completely new running surface. Working with Freedom Leisure, we have resurfaced the outdoor athletics track at the iconic stadium that was built in 1997 with works finishing this summer.

Even more Fabric!

One of last summer's most colourful community events in Ashford's high street will come to life again this year with an explosion of colour as beautiful fabric creations decorate the bandstand and town centre as part of The Fabric of Ashford.

The inspiring art installation is created by and for the local Ashford community, with local schoolchildren also due to take part.


With the grand finale taking place on Saturday 20 August, we will share more details of the project on all of our usual channels over the coming weeks, so look out for news on how you can get involved.

Food for thought

Repton Community Trust has supported over 3,500 people through our community-led food bank The Peoples Pantry which started as a cupboard of free food items for people visiting Repton Connect Community Centre.

It has provided food, cleaning and hygiene items to people in need including through our Covid-secure 24hr food lockers, online ordering, collections and deliveries. We started Kent's first community fridge in 2019, distributing surplus supermarket food and have grown to be one of Ashford's main food banks.

We have developed a community shop where people can donate towards food at a reduced cost and still have a great shopping experience. We support people from across the borough. Initiatives include the shop, a 'Good Mood Food' recipe box scheme, and our community fridges.



A brighter future

Councillor Jenny Webb was Mayor of Ashford between May 2019 to July 2020. The end of her term of office was greatly affected by the pandemic. Here she looks ahead to her new term and reveals which local charity she'll be supporting... Sound Museum on the line

Like many villages, Rolvenden Layne had a disused phone box at risk of becoming an eyesore. But now, with help from Ashford Borough Council, Rolvenden Parish Council, Kent County Council and Persimmon Homes, Skep Arts has transformed it into Kent's smallest museum.

On the back wall, where the phone used to be, is a box containing an MP3 player. When visitors crank the handle, they generate power to activate the sound files within. The first of a series of exhibitions, I Remember', presents the voices of older residents, recalling village life in the 1930s and 40s. Recorded by a local historian, they are moving records of a bygone age.

While the Sound Museum is tiny there are many potential exhibits it can present, stored on the MP3 player at its heart. It is curated by Skep Arts and maintained by the parish council. Entry is free. www.arts.theskep.uk



Changing face of Ashford

Jobs and investment on the horizon as town's transformation moves into exciting new chapter. Ashford continues to be a magnet for inward investment and regeneration, and as we emerge from the challenges of recent years there are several exciting projects on the cards. Together they signal a bright future for the town.



Brompton, the UK's largest bicycle manufacturer, has announced exciting plans to create a revolutionary new factory in Ashford by 2027.

The new factory will be constructed on a floodplain, which will provide an opportunity to restore the wetland and improve the flood mitigation of the site and promote walking and cycling opportunities.

The plans are subject to planning approval and commercial terms being agreed.



Newtown Works will breathe new life into the Grade II listed locomotive sheds, with the area being transformed into an international film and TV studios.

The plans also includes educational facilities, a hotel, serviced apartments and commercial units. Full planning permission was granted in September2020, with works expected to start on site in the summer.





Funding boost for Ashford College expansion plans

A major extension to Ashford College's Elwick Road campus has been given Government funding support. An 'Engineering Hub' is planned to open in September 2023, which will bring all 16-18 aged students together on the main college site in the heart of the town centre.



Creative arts hub

Jasmin Vardimon Company was founded in London in 1998 and rapidly rose to become a significant element within the British dance theatre scene.

As its much-anticipated new creative hub takes shape, it promises a state-of-the-art facility for the company to expand its activities locally, nationally and on the global stage.

Its new home in Javelin Way is expected to open this autumn and also includes a number of light industrial units which will welcome other creative companies.

Our Parks

Parks and green spaces have been a vital lifeline to many of us over the last few years for our mental health and wellbeing. Yet, our parks and green spaces have been under immense pressure, with us collecting more litter during the summer months than ever before.

As we head into warmer weather (we hope) and start spending more time in our parks here's our guide to make it enjoyable for everyone.



Save Water

We may be used to seeing lots of water with our weather however water is a precious resource that the changes in our weather are having an impact on.

Minimising the water we use in our homes will help minimise the stress our usage has on the planet.

Saving water also saves you money as about 20% of a typical gas heated home's heating bills comes from the water we use in our showers, baths and from the hot water tap.

We have collated our top tips for saving water this summer

1. Add a washing bowl to your sink to catch the excess water and use this to water your plants

uses less water than a bath – around 80 litres!





3. Install a water butt – The average roof collects about 85,000 litres of rain in a year, enough to fill 450 water butts with free rainwater!

4. Let's make this the year to let your lawn go naturally brown, it will soon bounce back after rainfall

• 5. Make sure you time when you water your plants as watering your plants in the early morning or evening when the temperature is cooler means less water is lost to evaporation.



Cycling UK have launched a new long-distance cycle route that will start and end in Wye. The 145-mile tour of Kent is called Cantii Way, which celebrates Kent's landscape, culture and history. The loop circles through quiet ways, country lanes, byways and bridleways and is designed to be manageable by anyone of reasonable fitness on most bike types. You can ride the route over three to four days in one go or it can be split into smaller routes, with incredible sights like Deal Castle and The White Cliffs of Dover. Thanks for your patience while we upgrade our Ashford site from Southern Water

After many people in the Kennington area complained about smells coming from our Ashford Wastewater Treatment Works, we're working closely with Ashford Borough Council and the Environment Agency to carry out upgrades and improvements to the site.

We've completed a thorough odour assessment and agreed an ambitious improvement plan in November 2020. A delivery team is now in place to carry out the necessary work.

The £3.5 million capital project includes covering up We plan to complete the project in late 2022. In the sludge tanks, monitoring and reviewing the efficiency meantime, residents continue to receive regular of odour control equipment, reducing the impact of updates. As part of the site's normal operation, the gases from tankers, installing automatic storm tank team also follows an odour management plan, cleaning systems, addressing the storage and carrying out twice-daily checks which are reported handling of treated sludge, fitting an additional odour to our Regional Control Centre so that they can control plant, and decommissioning disused respond to any potential enquiries from local residents with the most up-to-date information. open tanks.

Are we there yet?

A lot of work is currently being undertaken on the site, including:

- · Installation of an effective and automated cleaning system on all our storm tanks which will prevent waste deposits decomposing in the open channels and creating unpleasant smells.
- Off-gases from waste tankers are now being extracted and treated before being released into the atmosphere.
- Processed 'cake' (e.g. treated sludge) has been relocated, away from our site boundaries. The sludge treatment facility is being optimised in order to ensure the absolute minimal quantity of solids is kept on site at all times.



We're now focused on covering a large surface of waste holding tanks, as well as finishing installing a new Odour Control Unit to make sure odours emitted are captured and treated adequately.

What about green sustainable solutions?

Alongside this improvement project, the on-site team has planted a total of 70 trees and shrubs to act as an odour screen in more sensitive areas. Once fully grown, these will also promote biodiversity while contributing to our pledge to achieve net zero carbon by 2030.

Is it working?

The team is making good progress and, as we continue to work closely with Ashford Borough Council and the Environment Agency, the benefits of the scheme are already showing. While odour at our Wastewater Treatment Works can be a tricky issue to manage, particularly during the summer, the number of odour complaints sent to us by local residents between June and September 2021 had dropped 91% for our Ashford site (compared with the same period in 2020).



Priceless smiles thanks to versatile new play areas

Improving the health and wellbeing of our residents through accessible leisure facilities across all ages is one of our top priorities. Did you know that Hunter Avenue in Willesborough is now home to a brand new play area? Enjoy our visual montage of the new facilities on offer and find out what else is in the pipeline for the community...



Mayor Cllr Callum Knowles, who cut the ribbon on the big day was joined by four little helpers and was given blessing scarves to wear by the local Nepalese community. Free ice cream was a big hit! Over 150 people attended the event including local councillors and stakeholders, following on from a consultation with local residents and school children in early 2020. The results were used to shape the final design for the new play area.











What's next?

We have been overwhelmed by the positive reaction that we've seen on social media when sharing updates on play areas across the borough. Work is now underway to design and deliver new facilities at Central Park at Park Farm, Spearpoint Recreation Ground in Kennington and Ryland Road open space at Bockhanger.

Safer Streets – making Ashford town centre safer



In Autumn 2021, following a successful bid to the Home Office, Ashford was awarded almost £550,000 to make the streets of its town centre safer, particularly for women and girls.

Officers from Ashford Borough Council and Kent Police have been working to implement the project. Here's what has been delivered...

- The creation of the Ashford Streetwise app
- Active Bystander training has been delivered to more than 180 front line staff from businesses operating in the town centre
- A network of Safe Spaces premises people can go to if they need help and support when out in the town centre (look out for the window sticker or find them on the app)
- Additional Ashford Partnership Against Crime radios purchased to increase the number of guardians in the town centre (and support Safe Spaces)
- 20 school presentations, emphasising key safety messages and the importance of respect and healthy relationships
- CCTV cameras have been installed in Edinburgh Road car park and at Elwick Place, eight public space cameras have been installed in the town centre as well as wallmounted mirrors to improve sightlines

Safe Spaces

A Safe Space is a designated premises open to any member of the public in need of immediate help and support, by means of assistance in contacting an appropriate carer, friend, family member or emergency services.



If you feel unsafe and want to wait for a lift, feel unwell and require help, feel uncomfortable with a group of individuals, have been the victim of crime or are in any situation where you feel you need assistance, you can enter any premises displaying the 'Safe Space' logo and ask for help without fear of embarrassment.
