

Privacy Impact Assessment

Introduction

This Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA) CCTV is recommended in The Surveillance Camera Code of Practice, issued by the Surveillance Camera Commissioner in June 2013 in accordance with Section 30 (1) (a) of The Protection of Freedom Act 2012. The purpose of the PIA is to ensure that privacy risks are minimised while allowing the aims of the project to be met whenever possible.

Guidance is based on the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) Privacy Impact Assessment Handbook. The four areas which are highlighted by ICO as potential areas for loss of privacy in relation to personal data are;

- the privacy of personal information
- the privacy of the person
- the privacy of personal behaviour
- the privacy of personal communications

'Personal data' as stated within article 4 of the UK GDPR means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject'); an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person;

When considering the installation of a camera an Operational Requirement (OR) must be produced. The OR must be referred to as part of the installation and camera review process to ensure it meets and continues to be effective in addressing the purpose for which it was installed.

Ashford Borough Council operates the Public Space Surveillance (PSS) System in accordance with all laws and acknowledges that data may be release by investigatory bodies to identify persons of interest. A General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) compliant sign is clearly displayed in the proximity of all cameras to inform persons that PSS is in operation.

PSS does not discriminate against any particular section of the community. PSS records actual events that have taken place. To mitigate against all reasonable privacy risks arising from the PSS system where possible all cameras will not be installed directly in line with a window where privacy would be expected. Where there is a risk to privacy both mechanical and/or digital privacy masks will be considered at time of the camera being installed and this will be reviewed on a regular basis. All members of staff are fully trained and licenced by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).
